

# Introduction

Lo! the apostolic train  
Join the sacred Name to hallow;  
Prophets swell the loud refrain,  
And the white-robed martyrs follow;  
And from morn to set of sun,  
Through the Church the song goes on.

(“Holy God, We Praise Thy Name” stanza 3, based on the *Te Deum Laudamus*)

One of the distinctive elements of the Roman Catholic liturgical year is the celebration of the men and women who are called “holy”—the saints of the Roman calendar. On the General Roman Calendar and the Particular Calendar of the Church of the United States are several hundred followers of Jesus, remembered on a given day—usually but not exclusively on their *dies natalis*, i.e. the day they passed from this life and entered heaven.

Their number reaches from the beginning of the church down to our own day. The calendar of the saints makes present for us the “great cloud of witnesses” that surrounds us, encouraging us to continue running the race of our faith until all have completed the course set before us, and we join that “great throng beyond number” gathered before the throne of the Lamb.

The history of hymns commemorating the saints can be found in the *Liturgy of the Hours*, the four-volume compendium of psalms, readings, and prayers for every day. Many of these are of great antiquity, and some are written specifically about the saint being celebrated. But most of those on the calendar are commemorated with hymns for categories of saints—for martyrs, for bishops, for consecrated religious. This permits the commemoration of saints without the multiplicity of texts.

While these hymns for the Common of the Saints are very practical, they do not permit the worshiper to enter into the life and work of the saints in all their varied glory. This volume, which provides a hymn for each and every saint in both the General Roman Calendar and the Particular Calendar of the Church in the United States, provides a text that is (1) informed by the scriptures of each saint’s day, (2) reflective of the saint’s life and particular gifts used in the service of God and the Church, (3) compatible with pre-existing hymn tunes that facilitate their usefulness, and (4) within the normal parameters of an “office hymn” in the Roman Catholic tradition—texts that are addressed usually to God (not to the individual saint), ending with a stanza of doxology to the Triune God.

The relevance of these texts will be obvious for use in parochial grade schools, religious communities that have common celebrations of the Liturgy of the Hours, and individual parishes, which can find here a specific hymn to personalize their parish “feast of title.” The CD-ROM provided with the book makes use of the hymns more readily available for the purchaser.

It is the sincere prayer of the author that people will make use of these hymns to find yet another way to “praise God in his angels and in his saints!”
